

# Texas Master Naturalist Brazos Valley Chapter Meeting Agenda for August 11, 2016 Brazos Valley Museum of Natural History

#### I. Old Business

**A.** Bruce Neville - Re-adopt our Bylaws. When we originally adopted them, we did not need a Conflict of Interest

addendum. Now we do. According to our existing Bylaws, any change requires a 30-day notice to the membership prior to a vote. These have been vetted by the State Office. Once these documents are adopted, we can proceed with filing for 501(c)3 status.

Note that the only changes from the existing Bylaws are:

- 1) Changing the name to our new legal name on the cover and page 3, and
- 2) Adding the Conflict of Interest statement as an addendum.

The remainder of the Bylaws remain unchanged.

## II. New Business

- **A.** Donell Frank I would like to discuss the butterfly alley at Lick Creek Park and the availability of volunteers if the project with the developer goes through. I am currently talking with a company to go out there and hydroseed the area with a couple of mixes from the Native American seed company, the developer is going to pay for all of this. I am still in the process of talking to David Schmitz about what the TMN's role in the butterfly alley will be but I want to make sure we are all on board with the project before I commit to it.
- **B.** Amanda Chau Trash abatement projects:
  - 1. CITO (Cache in trash out)- Sept 17 or 24
  - 2. Gabbard/Brison trash pick up- Oct. 22, Nov 5, Nov. 12, or Nov. 19
  - 3. City of College Station Adopt-A-Greenway program- our two year commitment will end after our clean up in October or November. Does our chapter want to commit another two years to take care of Gabbard and Brison Parks?
- C. Amanda Chau Stream Team water monitoring projects:
  City of College Station is interested in monitoring Bee Creek and Wolf Pen Creek Tributary for water quality and E.coli count. Our Stream Team is currently working with the City to set up a one year monitoring project which requires monthly monitoring of specific monitoring sites.

A. President – Bruce Neville – Requests to the membership resulted in volunteers of Olivia Ash to fill the vacant Communication and Outreach Director position and Jackie Girouard to fill the new Youth Programs Director position. There have been no volunteers yet for a Field Trip Coordinator. The Youth Programs Director was identified by the membership as a priority during our retreat earlier in the year. There is no program description in the Chapter Operating Guidelines. It will be the job of the new Youth Programs Committee to establish goals for the committee to include in the Operating Guidelines. Thanks to the work of Mike Stecher and Amanda Chau, the Chapter has incorporated as a first step to filing for 501(c)3 status. As part of the process, we need to revise our Bylaws slightly and readopt them. The revised bylaws and a Conflict of Interest document need to be adopted by the membership. Those documents were circulated the required 30 days prior to a called membership meeting in August for adoption.

Thanks to the work of Mary Dabney Wilson and the New Member Training Committee, we have another great line-up of classes, field trips, and instructors for the fall class. The new Statewide Curriculum was finally published. Thanks to Betty Vermeire, we were able to get early copies at the chapter discount.
