<u>Angler Education – MN Hours:</u> - Develop and present sessions on angler education to increase participation in recreational fishing; teach youth and adults how to be safe, knowledgeable, and ethical anglers while protecting the environment. *If you are an instructor that has ordered supplies, your hours need to go in the TPWD system, not Master Naturalists. Contact your Admin for assistance.*Project Opportunity Category = Training & Educating Others (Direct)

<u>Bell County Plant Sales – CTMN Booth</u> – Participate in plant sales in Bell County, such as NPSOT and Bell Count Master Gardner by having a booth to answer questions about CTMN, having displays, and for fundraising. *Project Opportunity Category = Public Outreach (Indirect)*

<u>Belton ISD Programs/Projects</u> - Programs and Projects at schools in the Belton School District including Career Days, Science Fairs, Angler Education, and other similar activities. *Please indicate specific activity in hour reporting remarks. Project Opportunity Category = Training & Educating Others (Direct)*

<u>Belton/Morgan's Point Public Landscape Maintenance</u> – Adding landscaping to public areas for butterflies and pollinators, adding pocket prairies, maintain these public areas, such as Bell Count Museum, Belton Library, AgriLife Extension, Morgan's Point ML Smith Park, among others. *Project Opportunity Category = Nature/Public Access*

May include Career Days, Angler Education, Science Fairs, and other similar activities. <u>Cornell University or National Audubon Society: Citizen Scientist Activities</u> - Citizen Scientist activities that include recording and submitting data to Cornell University. <u>Earth Day Activities</u> - All Master Naturalist (includes those by AgriLife and TPWD) sponsored outreach activities relating to Earth Day - lead hikes, lead interpretive tours, staff a TMN information booth, support activities, etc. <u>Project Opportunity Category = Public Outreach (Indirect)</u>

<u>Environmental Education Youth Activities</u> - Environmental education youth activities at local schools and area youth clubs including student career days and activities utilizing Chapter discovery trunks and field research activities for students. *Project Opportunity Category = Training & Educating Others (Direct)*

<u>Field Investigation Day – TWAF</u> - Could include various locations to teach students about Habitats, Water Cycle, Erosion, Water Quality and other environmental topics. <u>Sponsored by the Texas Wildlife Association</u>. <u>Project Opportunity Category = Training & Educating Others (Direct)</u>

<u>Fort Cavazos Clean-up Activities</u> - Volunteer work: various gardening activities to maintain pollinator garden, general invasive removal, waterway cleanup, trail maintenance and cleanup, other activities relating to removing foreign debris from natural areas. <u>Project Opportunity Category = Nature/Public Access</u>

<u>Mayborn Museum Docent or Interpreter</u> – Interpreter will work wither in a n indoor gallery or in the Historic Village, provide guest additional information about the exhibits, offer direction toward educational resources. Interpreters in the historic Village are encouraged to wear period accurate clothing to add more to the depth of the interpretation of the village. Provide professional and accurate representation of Mayborn Museum/exhibit; engage discussion about exhibits; ensure safety; notify staff member of concerns; educate guests on material presented in the galleries. Special training established by museum for each volunteer. Project Opportunity Category = Training & Educating Others (Direct)

<u>Miller Springs Nature Center Projects/Special Events</u> - Chapter organized educational activities, trail walks and talks, benefiting Miller Springs Nature Center and in keeping with the mission of the TMN. *This opportunity does not include maintenance nor construction*. *Project Opportunity Category = Public Outreach (Indirect)*

<u>Miller Springs Workday – 2nd Thursdays</u> - Volunteer Project: Assist with cleanup efforts at the Miller Springs Nature Center near Belton Dam. We will be helping to beautify the center and assist with trail building and trail maintenance, and removing invasive species. There is no obligation here- it is "choose your own adventure" and you can earn volunteer hours toward your TX MN obligations as a result of being included. *Project Opportunity Category = Field Research (including surveys)*

<u>National State Archery in School Program</u> - Texas State Tournament - assistance in all aspects of this event. *Project Opportunity Category = Public Outreach (Indirect)*

<u>Nolan Creek Hike and Bike Cleanup</u> - This group meets every 5th Thursday (weather permitting) to remove trash from Belton's Nolan Creek Hike and Bike Trail. Meet at Confederate Park's Park and Ride. Hours spent on other days of the week spent on this project may also be recorded here. *Project Opportunity Category = Nature/Public Access*

<u>Other Opportunities</u> - Opportunities that support the TMN Mission but do not fall under any of the Federal Reporting Categories (total hours must be less than 5% of the chapter annual total) get prior chapter approval before participating for service hours.

<u>Peaceable Kingdom Retreat for Children: plant ID, hiking asst, trail work, gardening</u> – Cleanup activities, creating or maintaining wildlife viewing blinds and wildscapes are also included. <u>Project Opportunity Category = Nature/Public Access.</u>

<u>Peaceable Kingdom Retreat for Children: Discovery Box teaching, classroom instruction, interpretive hikes</u> - Classroom instruction, delivering workshops, and interpretive hikes are also activities included. <u>Project Opportunity Category = Training & Educating Others</u> (<u>Direct</u>)

<u>U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) Project Workday</u> - Natural resource management project work on behalf of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at various ACOE area parks. Activities such as trails construction and maintenance and habitat restoration, trash pickup and other work as applied to a project. *Project Opportunity Category = Nature Resource Management*

<u>VMS Implementation and Support</u> - As part of the state VMS Support Team, provide assistance with the implementation of, training, and support for the VMS by training volunteers to use the system, supporting chapter admins in implementing the system, troubleshooting, and assisting with the help desk. *Project Opportunity Category = Chapter & Program Business /Administration*

<u>Waco Wetlands: Water Programs and Activities: TMN Report Hours</u> - Presenting information through hands-on activities or other means to Waco Wetland visitors; this opportunity includes elementary field trips. <u>AT: Chapter Field Trip</u> – Learn about replication of Blackland Prairie and the plants and fauna associate with the prairie, along with conservation practices to reclaim the land. Led by landowner and other experts in the field. Includes Burleson Prairie Walk.

AT: Chapter Meeting-CenTex - Provides for 1 hour of Advanced Training (AT) presented at Chapter Meetings.

<u>AT: Cornell University on line non-credit courses</u> - Online non-credit courses applicable to nature and nature education. For more information go to http://civicecology.org/course-ne.

<u>AT: CTMN Presentations other than Chapter Meetings</u> - AT opportunities present themselves from time to time, whenever another CTMN member gives a presentation at a venue other than a regular chapter meeting.

<u>AT: Extension Online Campus – Webinars and Courses</u> - Online webinars and courses offered by the Cooperative Extension System. http://campus.extension.org/ *Please enter course name in remarks.*

AT: Gault School of Archaeological Research - Tour and educational talk about the history and use of the Gault Site.

Participants must volunteer an additional 20 hours beyond their normal volunteer hours on the subject of entomology by completing a project, to be discussed at the end of the course.

AT: Texas Invasives - Learn to identify and report invasive species of Texas.

<u>AT: Texas Pollinator PowWow</u> - Texas Pollinator Powwow is a non-profit that hosts annual conferences. Their mission is to provide education, resources, and networking opportunities to natural resource management professionals and volunteers- and the community at large-and to empower them all in conserving our pollinators and their habitats across the landscape. *Held at the Ladybird Johnson Wildflower Center*

<u>AT: Texas Water Resources Institute, NRCS, TAMU Agrilife, TPWD, TRWD</u> – Water resource education lecture/workshop and stream walk. Riparian watershed management and water quality. Riparian vegetation and hinderances to healthy riparian areas. Management practices, local resources, and photo monitoring of streams. Trip to creek for stream walk.

<u>AT: Texas Wildlife Association Presentations</u> - Webinars, workshops, and talks focusing on wildlife, plants, natural resources, land management and water.

<u>AT: TMN Annual Meeting</u> - Advanced Training earned by attending one or more advanced training sessions at the TMN Annual State Meeting in October. *Complete the survey once for EACH session identifying the session title and presenter name in the description text box. Do not lump multiple sessions together (even if on the same day).*

AT: TMN Tuesday - Learn more about the heart of the Master Naturalist program and how to become a chapter leader in the future.

Only AT which may be viewed live **OR pre-recorded, from the current CY. This AT is presented by the State Master Naturalists. Put the date of the program in the notes. The date you watched will go in the start date.

AT: TPWD Training - All Texas Parks and Wildlife Department training for volunteers; must be consistent with Texas Master Naturalist Objectives as stated in the mission statement.

AT: Trail Construction and Maintenance Course - Developed by Pacific Crest Trail Ass. and U.S. Forest Service Trails Specialist John Schubert, consisting of a classroom section, covering work safety, basics of sustainable trail design and construction, hillside hydrology and factors important to building safe trails. Maintenance tasks like clearing and brushing the trail corridor and maintaining various types of water features, building new tread, water bars, water checks, rehabilitating old tread, building rock steps and other kins of steps, retaining walls, switchbacks, water crossings, and other water management structures will also be covered.

<u>AT: Training/Education Events at Mother Neff State Park</u> - Any advanced training for Master Naturalists and consistent with the mission of the Texas Master Naturalists. Time is counted for the educational part of the event only. *Do NOT count travel time.*

<u>AT: TX Riparian & Stream Ecosystem Workshop</u> - Includes any Riparian Workshop covering the Leon River, Big Elm Creek, Lampasas River, Nolan Creek watersheds. *For others, get prior approval*.

AT: TX Waters Certification Training - With this curriculum, we want to inform and educate the citizens of Texas about the most precious natural resource Texas possesses, its water. Many challenges face our state concerning water, particularly in our aquatic habitats and water for wildlife. This curriculum will allow Texas Master Naturalists and other concerned citizens to earn a Texas Waters Specialist designation and then start giving back to their community by performing community service in areas like: Water focused educational activities such as fairs, festivals, events, outreach, Projects such as habitat restoration, creek cleanups, aquifer recharge/karst feature flagging and clearing, etc., or Demonstrations like runoff models, runoff landscape features such as dry creek beds, rain gardens, etc.

<u>AT: VMS Training</u> – Advanced Training, VMS Training webinars with a follow-up Q&A; training conducted by the State VMS Support Team for a chapter designated VMS admin.

AT: Waco Mammoth National Monument - Guided tour of Mammoth Site

<u>AT÷ Water Conservation Symposium</u> – It is a come and go event that will include speakers and booths emphasizing water conservation, native landscaping, and how to maximize your green space.

<u>AT: Website Training/update</u> - Webmaster beginning and advanced topics in WordPress pertaining to the chapter web site (integrating Facebook, adding posts, modifying content).

AT: Zebra Mussel Training - Learning how to identify zebra mussels in area lakes (including Fort Hood) as presented by a recognized expert on the subject.

<u>Administrative Work: TMN Admin Report Hours:</u> Select a sub-category. Project Opportunity Category = Chapter & Program Business /Administration

- <u>Chapter Meeting</u> activities relating to preparing for, presiding over, or setting up and tear down for a regular chapter meeting (other than hospitality activities see Hospitality below)
- <u>Board/Committee Work</u> any activity in support of the chapter through duties as a chapter recognized committee member, or your activities in conducting chapter business as a member of the Chapter Board
- <u>President Duties</u> any of the chapter activities which, as outlined in the Chapter Operating Handbook, are conducted in your official capacity as Chapter President (planning meeting agendas, interfacing with other chapters or agencies)
- <u>Treasurer Duties</u> any of the chapter activities which, as outlined in the Chapter Operating Handbook, are conducted in your official capacity as the Chapter Treasurer (preparing a budget and budget reports, presenting budget related information to the chapter)
- <u>Secretary Duties</u> any of the chapter activities which, as outlined in the Chapter Operating Handbook, are conducted in your official capacity as Chapter Secretary
- Hours Management activities relating to the review and approval of submitted hours, the preparation of reports concerning AT and Service hours both to the chapter and the State Program Office; volunteers who are officially designated by the chapter leadership to enter hours for other volunteers when those volunteers are unable to do so themselves
- <u>Hospitality</u> those activities related to organizing others to prepare refreshments or the actual preparation of refreshments for chapter activities to include serving, delivery, setup of refreshments
- <u>Communications</u> activities relating to promoting the chapter news and events through the production of a newsletter (writing articles, preparing the newsletter, publishing the newsletter), preparing and publishing a chapter brochure, videos that promote TMN and/or the chapter, providing information to newspapers, radio, television and other media outlets
- <u>Website and Social Media</u> activities related to developing and maintaining a web site and/or Facebook site for the chapter or other social media outlets

- Recruiting activities related to promoting the Texas Master Naturalist program and/or organization
- <u>Training Classes</u> activities related to supporting the Training Class though mentorship or as a class helper (distribute handouts, setting up); does not include presentation time nor at-home time spent preparing refreshments
- **Fundraising** those activities related to raising funds or obtaining/creating items for the chapter that can be used to generate funds for the chapter, or such activities as grant writing for the chapter or State Program
- <u>Samaritan VMS Rollout</u> those activities related to the rollout of the VMS for chapter personnel: preparing chapter data for conversion, training your volunteers; for the VMS Team: activities involving assisting chapter personnel with any aspect of the conversion to include chapter training, troubleshooting and responding to Help Desk questions, editing chapter upload files
- <u>State Meeting</u> activities relating to the support of the State Annual Meeting (preparing chapter contest entries), working as a volunteer at the State Meeting; does not include presentations
- <u>State Program Office</u> activities by a chapter volunteer relating to work performed in direct support of the State Program Office (SPO): State Executive Committee, creating presentations or conducting research)
