Cradle of Texas Chapter, TMN, Class of 2005

The Intern Class of 2005 has matriculated and added another group of quality folks to our community of COT Master Naturalists. Despite the disruption from Hurricane Rita, 18 of the 19 participating interns of the 2005 training class completed their basic required 10 sessions by the November 16th graduation session, and our "19th" student has just completed her one required makeup class. That's 100% graduating!

Twelve of the 19 interns attended all of the twelve sessions, giving them a four advanced-hour start toward certification, and another four interns completed eleven classes. Many are well on their way toward accumulating their 40 volunteer hours needed for certification.
