**Opening:** The meeting was called to order by President Carl Dodson at 8:58 a.m. Six of the eight voting Board members, eight committee chairmen, the assistant to the secretary, and four interested chapter members were present. The attendance record is on file.

# **President's Report:**

### • "Hold Harmless" Form

Original signed forms are on file with the Cooperative-Extension office, and a copy of each is in the Chapter file on the second floor of the TCEO. A list of those whose signed forms are in the Chapter file was circulated, and blank forms were available for those not on the list. The President said we would try to catch others who do not have signed forms on file at future meetings, and mail forms to the

remainder well before the September 30 deadline.

### Resource Library

Jim Renfro was commended for his good work on the list of resources made available to all members via the website. Terry Woodward and John Thayer were also recognized as important contributors to the resources list research. Since it will always be a work in progress, members are encouraged to let Webmaster Neal McLain know of recommended additions.

# • State TMN Annual Meeting Project

The COT Chapter is committed to presenting one of our projects on a storyboard for the October State TMN annual meeting. Carolyn May-Monie will chair the project with the assistance of Sandra Clarke, Neal McLain, Candace Novak, Ed Barrios, and Marty Cornell.

• The President led a spirited discussion, during which all of our projects for the year were reviewed. Various criteria were identified: number of people reached, number of COT members involved, number of sessions offered, whether TMNs outside the COT Chapter were significantly involved, whether a partnering or sponsoring organization was the site, whether the project could have been completed without COT Chapter involvement, the scope of the project, the availability of photos and other display materials to make an interesting presentation, and whether the project fulfilled the purpose of the

organization as defined in the By-Laws.

••A straw vote was taken and two projects received the most votes, eight each: Innovene (BP-AMOCO) and the BNWR. There was a consensus that without the COT members the Innovene project would not have been successful, but that BNWR volunteers serve a far greater number of children. Carolyn's committee will make a recommendation after researching the above criteria.
