**WANTED: A Certified TMN Member who knows and enjoys the "Dunes, Estuaries and Wetlands".** The Intern Training program has had two potential Instructors drop out because their schedules conflict. The scheduled date is August 12th and will include both Class and Field at the location of your choice. (This date can be changed for your convenience.) Each part should be two hours in length to meet the training criteria. Hand-outs should be available and seining is the *piece de resistance* both in the Gulf and the Wetlands. The Training Director will be available to assist with research and development/duplication of hand-outs. **INTERN ENROLLMENT STATUS:** As of to-date, we have 6 Interns that started in 2009, mostly the 4th Quarter, of which one is within ONE hour of becoming a TMN. The remaining 5 are more than half way through their training.

I happened to be at San Bernard National Wildlife Refuge a couple weeks ago when an injured juvenile Hawksbill Turtle arrived. It (sex unknown) was on its way to the NOAA Fisheries Service Galveston Laboratory for rehab. Christin McLemore, USFWS Sea Turtle Patrol Coordinator for the 2010 nesting season, was preparing it for the trip.

The turtle had been caught in some plastic netting when rescued. Christin, Curtis Jones, and Refuge Manage Shane Kasson examined it carefully. It appeared to be in reasonable health, with all four flippers intact. It seemed quite active.
