## Sunday the adventures continue!

Sunday, April 17, begins with birding at Quintana Neotropical Bird Sanctuary and a herpetology tour. As part of the Amazing Adventures excursions, they are designed to give people an opportunity to team up with naturalists and get a focused look at the flora and fauna of the area. The size of the groups are restricted to fit the activities.

Marsh buggy tours, kayaking, a walk to the San Bernard Oak and a naturalist walk in the Dow Woods Unit round out the day. Myriad activities for children, exhibits and food service are available during the afternoon.

One of the favorite programs, the Earth-Quest Birds of Prey show, returns with two presentations Sunday afternoon.

### Birds of Prey put on a show



Returning this year to present four programs at Migration Celebration is EarthQuest and their Birds of Prey Show. During these demonstrations, visitors get an up close and personal look at falcons, hawks and even a condor.

Handler Steve Hoddy demonstrates the birds' skills as they fly overhead and he explains how birds of prey hunt and why they behave in ways that are always entertaining as well as educational.

The programs are April 16 beginning at 9:30 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., and April 17 beginning at 1:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.
