
Nominations Committee Report


The nominations committee included Dave Brandes (Chair), Ed Barrios, and Joan Simonsen.
















"Birds and Bottomlands Blitz"

Editors note: The TMN-COT Chapter and Gulf Coast Bird Observatory have jointly organized a series of presentations known as "Birds and Bottomlands Blitz." These presentations will take place on the second Saturday of each month, and they are open to the public. Chapter members are encouraged to assist with these presentations. A Mini Christmas Bird Count (CBC) at the Gulf Coast Bird Observatory (GCBO) Sanctuary on Buffalo Camp Bayou will be conducted on Dec 10, 2011 from 9 to 11 am for anyone interested in learning what a Christmas Count is all about.

Christmas Bird Counts started on December 25, 1900 to count bird species and the total number of individuals seen in one day. This was to counter a longtime tradition of some to kill as many birds as they could on Christmas Day.

The National Audubon Society president, Frank Chapman started this campaign. It has continued every year since and last year over 62,000 folks in the Americas participated in 2,215 counts and reported 61,359,451 individual birds. Over 646 species were seen in the United States. This year will be the 112th count.

Several local counts will be held here in Brazoria County during December. See Schedule below.

The Mini CBC will be conducted by volunteers of the Cradle of Texas chapter of Texas Master Naturalists. Leaders will be Jerry Eppner and Tom Morris who will discuss more details of a Christmas Count, lead participants in a search for birds and compile results after a tour of short nature trails. If you have binoculars, please bring them. If not, a limited amount of binoculars will be available.

You do not have to be knowledgeable about birds, as there will be volunteers to help you identify the birds seen. A list of the wintering birds to be expected will be given to all participants.

Families are welcome and children must be accompanied by parents.

This is the first in a series of events to be held on the second Saturday of each month through May at GCBO featuring the Columbia Bottomlands.
