Ever wonder what CTMN Board members do? What their duties and responsibilities are? Who makes decisions for our chapter—a committee, the Officers, the entire Board, or the President herself?

Duties of all board members include adhering to the TMN Code of Ethics and Standards of Conduct [see <u>https://txmn.tamu.edu/chapter-resources/chapter-documents/</u>]; maintaining confidentiality when dealing with individual member issues; striving to further the Texas Master Naturalist mission in everything one does; communicating effectively with the state office; remembering that every chapter and every member represent the public face of the TMN Program and its sponsoring agencies; and serving as a model of leadership while recruiting and developing new leaders for the chapter.

Responsibilities of the Board include having the authority to conduct the chapter's business as defined by the Bylaws; overseeing committee work; honoring expenditure limits set by the chapter; voting on an annual budget, new projects, and other issues that arise; setting dues; retaining records; and training new chapter leaders as they move into leadership positions. We hold monthly Board meetings via Zoom, usually on the first Monday of each month.

Duties of each officer and Director are specified in the Chapter Operating Handbook.

Cross Timbers Chapter has been fortunate to have many individuals who have served, often behind the scenes, giving significant time and effort to various aspects of supporting the chapter. Time spent on chapter administration earns Volunteer Hours toward recertification.

(2) In writing (written story and/or poetry).

Please choose one format per story. You're welcome to share more than one story if you'd like to try each format (just submit the form again!). To submit your story, please fill out the form <u>here</u>.

Tips on writing down your experiences:

- Find a nice quiet place to write and let your ideas flow out onto the page for a few minutes without self-interruption.
- When you're ready to put on your editor's hat don't forget to spell check your work.
- Keep stories short and sweet, for example no more than 1 page in Word/google doc.

Tips on taking a great selfie video:

- Be sure to wear your favorite TMN regalia (hats/ patches/t-shirts/sweaters etc.) if you have them, when recording.
- Find a nice nature spot outside for a backdrop.
- Notice what sounds and noises surround your spot. Try to avoid, if possible, any sounds that may make it difficult for the microphone to catch your words (for example traffic noise and/or windy days).
- Have a good light source. When outside, mornings and evenings can give you a nice soft light good for videos.
- If it helps you to stay on track, write down your thoughts before recording and have your notes close at hand.
