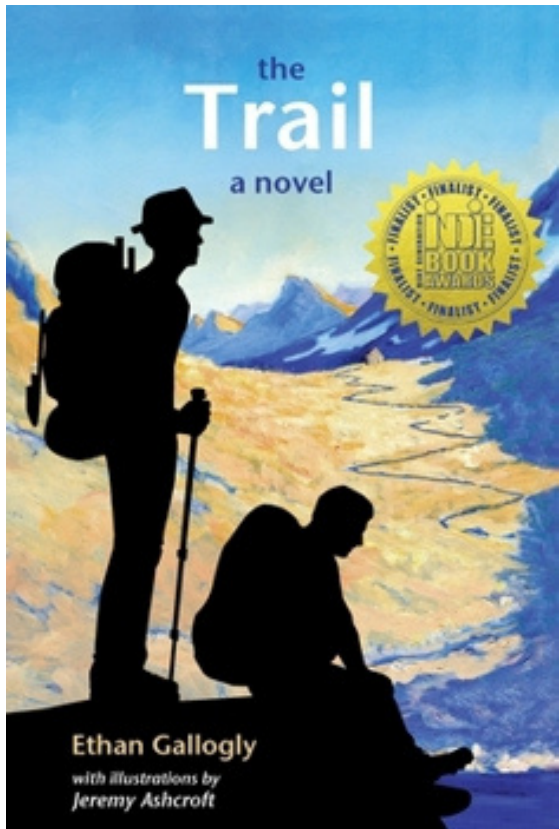
Another very interesting AT opportunity is coming up on 10/25/2025 at Charles Snowden's tree farm from 10 to 12:30. Food afterwards, and please contact Roger to determine if any other food needs to be brought to the pot luck. The AT presentation for the night was on recycling opportunities locally in Marshall and Jefferson. Terracycle.com was mentioned as a great site for all things recycle. Plastics #1, #2, #5 can be recycled, Sams has a bin for plastics in their parking lot in Longview. For plastics like grocery bags or paper towel bags can be recycled at Walmart/Krogers. Walmart will also take old eyeglasses. Electronics can be taken to Staples in Shreveport or possibly city may take on a bi-annual basis, call your local trash service to see. Glass can be recycled in Longview behind the fire stations, #2 at Eastman Rd, #3 at Birdsong, and #7 at Gilmer Rd.

The best thing is to minimize your use of plastics as much as possible.

Aluminum cans are easy to recycle and you can turn them into a metal recycling place for money. Or you can take them to Pet Place in Marshall and they will turn them into animal food for their animals.

The Rotary Club of Jefferson will take electronics from 9-12 at the National Bank site on 11/15.
