### Fun Bullfrog Facts:

- Bullfrogs can jump up to 10 times the length of their body in a single leap.
- Their deep “jug-o-rum” call can carry more than half a mile on a quiet night.
- Bullfrogs are the largest frogs in North America, sometimes growing over 8 inches long!

# HIKE INTO WELLNESS: TRAILS NEAR JEFFERSON, TX

Hiking isn't just a walk in the woods—it's one of the best all-around exercises for both body and mind. It boosts heart health, burns calories, builds balance and strength, and reduces stress. Plus, spending time outdoors sharpens focus and creativity while giving you a break from screens.

We're fortunate to have plenty of beautiful hikes local to us.

- Caddo Lake State Park – Explore moss-draped cypress forests on trails like Pine Ridge Loop and CCC Cut-Through.
- Atlanta State Park – 4.5 miles of trails around Wright Patman Lake, with spring redbuds and dogwoods.
- Daingerfield State Park – Scenic lake loops, wildflowers, and towering pines in a peaceful 500-acre park.
- Caddo Lake National Wildlife Refuge – Trails and boardwalks through diverse habitats, with birdwatching galore.
- 1North Adventure Park – Family-friendly trails and outdoor fun just minutes away.

## Tips for the Trail

- Start with short, marked trails.
- Bring water, snacks, and comfy shoes.
- Trekking poles can help with balance.
- Most of all—take your time and enjoy nature!

Hiking is a simple, low-cost way to get moving, connect with nature, and recharge your spirit. With so many options nearby, your next adventure is just around the corner.

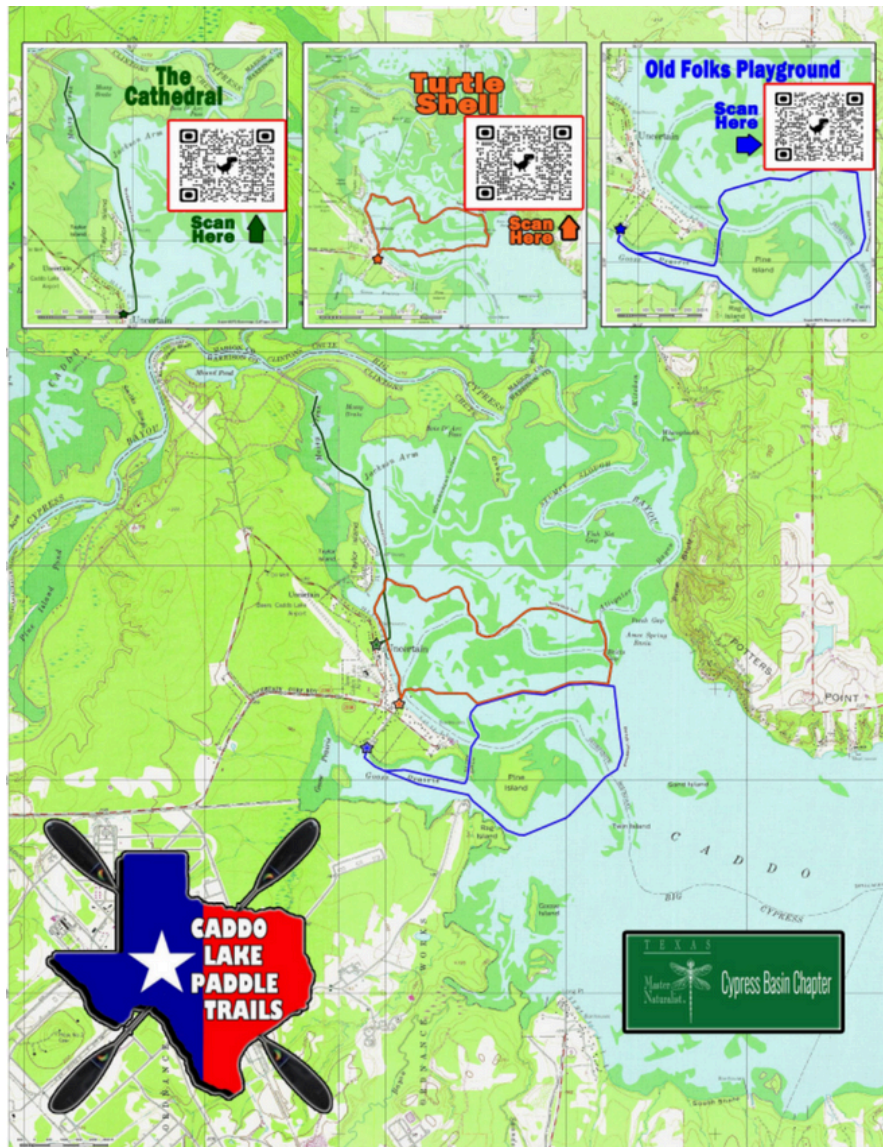
