







December 11, 2014, 10 AM to 1 PM




From the intersection of N. Carroll and W. Hickory drive North on N. Carroll, approximately 1.2 miles, to Sherman Drive. Turn Right on Sherman Drive and drive approximately 6/10 of a mile to the intersection of Sherman and Bell. Turn left on Bell at the stoplight and Trinity Presbyterian Church is on the right.

If you are coming from out of town take I 35E to the 377 / Fort Worth Drive [Exit # 465B]. Turn North on 377 / Fort Worth drive. At the intersection of W. Collins and 377 / Fort Worth Drive continue straight (North) on Carroll. When arriving at the intersection of N. Carroll and W. Hickory, follow the map above. A photo of the Church with key points is below.

2. Front door = West side building.
3. **Meeting facility = Fellowship Hall**
From front door walk straight into hall.
4. Large parking lot on the right (South side) of the building.


Thank each of you for being the person you are. My life is richer because you are part of it. Take care of each other, spread that special brand EFCTMN love and happy holidays to all.
