What is a wetland?

Wetlands are a vanishing but important part of the Texas Coastal Plains where we live. More than half the bird species in North America depend on wetlands for some part of their life cycles.

Wetlands have been called the "Earth's kidneys" because they naturally filter and break down pollutants through the plants and microbes that live in them. Restoring and creating freshwater wetlands in our area will improve water quality, natural habitat for wildlife and green space for people to enjoy.
