Trash Bash Annual event at numerous locations in Galveston Bay Area, including Bay Area Park, Dickinson Bayou, Texas City Prairie Preserve and others. Work includes shoreline and waterway cleanup and activities supporting the event.

General Volunteer Opportunities (Various non-sponsored, not site-specific activities)

Bats Public outreach activities supporting bats, including the bat talks at Waugh Avenue Bridge in Houston and other locations.

Bat Project Acoustic Monitoring - Bat Project Acoustic Monitoring is a citizen science project initiated by Texas Nature Trackers to do acoustic monitoring of bats statewide.

Bird Monitoring and Surveys - Participation in field surveys, sponsored by a variety of organizations with whom the chapter has ongoing relationships such as GCBO, Cornell Lab, and Audubon. Includes Christmas bird counts. Please put the name of organization/activity in the comments.

Nature Program - Public Outreach Leading, organizing, or staffing an educational activity where participants can come and go. Writing educational articles/brochures, staffing a booth or visitor center Examples include docents at Moody Gardens and other locations that are not covered with our major partners. Please put activity and location in comments.

Nature Program - Training & Educating/Youth Field Trips Leading, organizing, developing, instructing or staffing an educational activity where participants have a planned learning objective and generally stay for the full event. Examples include educational activities at Moody Gardens, Treasures of the Bay and others not covered under our major partners. Please put activity in the comments.

Scientific Field Studies Activities associated with the gathering of research data, organization of information and reporting studies as required to collection organizations. Includes iNaturalist activities.

Shoreline Monitoring/Cleanup Projects to remove harmful debris from shoreline habitats on Galveston islands and the mainland waterways. Not to be used for GISP, TCPP, ABNC, or SLSP locations. Please put location/activity in the comments.

Water Quality Monitoring Ongoing water quality monitoring at various key sites in the area. Includes nurdle collecting/activities. Please put activity in the comments.

Wildlife Rescue/Rehab/Care Wildlife rescue, care and/or rehabilitation that is not at ABNC, GISP, SLSP, SJBG, TCPP or sea turtles.
