Park West Forest Restoration

Description: Join the Park West Forest Restoration Team meeting every Thursday. We have a 48 acre park to reclaim from invasive ligustrum and chinaberry, so dress for outdoor work and bring water and tools. Our First Forest area, begun by Class #1 in 2014, is looking wonderful - like a true Texas forest of oaks, cedar elms, and pecans. If you're not ready to work, and just want to take a look, bring the team some yummies for the 10 AM water break.

Wear: Long sleeves, long pants, hat, closed-toe shoes and work gloves.

Bring: Drinking water; BYO Tools - lopping shears, small saws, pruners.

Why: When bamboo, ligustrum and other invasive plants dominate the forest, Texas oaks, pecans and cedar elms are starved by the alien plants. If nothing is done to remove the foreign invaders, our native forest with all its botanical diversity, birds, wildlife and botanical beauty will be lost.

Texas Stream Team Training

Texas Stream Team at The Meadows Center for Water and the Environment is a statewide environmental education and volunteer-based water quality monitoring program. Citizen scientists are trained to collect and submit surface water and environmental quality data that can then be used to promote and protect the 191,000 miles of Texas waterways.

<u>"Texas Raptor Monitoring Network: a participatory science program to monitor the reproductive biology of raptors across Texas."</u>

*Date: Tuesday, March 5, 2024

Time: 12:00 – 1:00 PM **Location:** WebEx

Description: This month's speakers are Dr. Ben Skipper, Associate Professor in the Department of Biology at Angelo State University and Dr. Clint Boal, Assistant Unit Leader for the USGS Texas Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit at Texas Tech University.

This program will use the monitoring of raptor nests as a model for engaging with the public through participatory science. Raptors are charismatic wildlife with wide public appeal. Since the 1960's several species of raptor have adapted to urban and suburban environments, yet much remains to be learned about the reproductive ecology of many species in these areas. This participatory science program therefore would serve to fill this data gap and provide relevant information back to participants. Workshop participants will be provided instruction on identification of raptor species, the identification of different stages within the nesting cycle and their associated behaviors, and the balance between gathering data and disturbing nesting birds. Data collection will be made simple via an electronic form with pre-defined fields that can be accessed via any internet-connected device (e.g., smartphone, tablet, desktop computer).
