Park West Forest Restoration

The dedicated Park West Resource Management volunteer crew has completed its 10th year of forest restoration work in Park West. The two leaders, Nancy Masterson and John Barrington, begin each work-season by presenting a proposed Plan of Work to the Seguin Parks and Recreation management and get their consent. We began work on the first Thursday in November and ended on April 25, completing 412 volunteer-hours in all.

We began the season with a review of safety precautions, work areas and plant identification of natives and invasives. Tools are labeled, designated locations for branch piles shown, and emergency forms are updated. Our cherished traditions now include the 10 AM water break, (sometimes with yummies), a January walk-thru of First Forest where we began under Monta Zengerle's leadership, and a wildflower seeding day in Bambooo! Corner where we once eradicated the Asian bamboo stand. We submit a workday report every week to the Parks Dept, which is now providing a trailer for all our cut branches. Our cuttings are a source of free mulch for the citizens of Seguin.

We finish each season with a small celebration on the last Thursday in April. This year we are enthused by the possibility of winning an H-E-B Trees for Texans grant for planting young trees in Park West in 2025. The Texas Forest Service has been particularly encouraging. Come join us next fall!

Citizen scientists are trained to collect and submit surface water and environmental quality data that can then be used to promote and protect the 191,000 miles of Texas waterways.
