

TEXAS MASTER NATURALIST PROGRAM **Guadalupe Chapter**

Dear Prospective Member-in-Training:

Thank you for your interest in the Guadalupe Chapter of the Texas Master Naturalist program. The Texas Master Naturalist program is a statewide organization sponsored by both the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and Texas A&M AgriLife Extension. The mission of the Texas Master Naturalist Program is to develop a corps of well-informed volunteers to provide education, outreach and service dedicated to the beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within their communities.

In the Master Naturalist program, you will enhance your love of the outdoors with research-based scientific knowledge. You will receive in-depth training in wildlife and resource management taught by recognized experts. You will also have the opportunity for advanced training in topics that interest you. Once certified, you will be able to provide our community with volunteer service in the form of educational or citizen science projects.

Our next certification training class begins Tuesday, August 5, 2025 and continues to November 15, 2025. Classes will be every other Tuesday evenings from 5:45 - 9:15 PM, at the Agrilife Building in Seguin, unless otherwise indicated. Training includes classroom time, Saturday morning field trips, and independent outdoor activities to enrich the learning process. Topics include ecoregions of Texas, water resources, wildlife and rangeland management, among others. The faculty includes university professors, biologists, wildlife specialists, geologists and more.

To become certified, you must attend all scheduled classes, field trips and outdoor activities totaling 50 hours. Then you are expected to complete an additional 40 hours of volunteer service and 8 hours of advanced training within one year of the completion of the class (Nov 2026). Only those completing all classwork and the additional 40/8 hours will be awarded the Master Naturalist certification. Your trainers can steer you to make-up opportunities if you must miss a class. They will show you volunteer opportunities that will be open for you to work on your certification requirements as soon as your background check is complete.

To maintain certification, Texas Master Naturalists must complete 40 hours of volunteer service and 8 hours of advanced training annually. As you strive to meet the yearly commitments, you will have the opportunity to work with experts and other volunteers on projects that benefit our community and our natural resources.

The cost of the class is \$175. This fee covers the cost of your background check, Master Naturalist textbook, Master Naturalist T-shirt, name tag and any additional materials. The application deadline is August 1, 2025. Early registration is strongly encouraged. To provide a quality experience for each student, class size is limited to 20. Please carefully consider the responsibilities of becoming a Certified Master Naturalist:

- I am 18 years of age or older and I agree to a background check
- I will be available for a total of 50 Class Hours which include:
 - Eight class sessions of 3.5 hours each (28 hrs)
 - Three field trips (2-3 hrs each)
 - Four different orientation volunteer activities (8 hrs) chosen from a list
 - Six continuing education opportunities, (6 hrs) including organizational meetings
- I understand that I must attend all scheduled classes or make-up missed classes to graduate
- I agree to report my volunteer hours on a regular basis
- I understand that in order to achieve recognition as a Certified Master Naturalist, I must complete 40 additional hours of approved volunteer service and obtain 8 hours of approved advanced training within one year of completion of the class
- I understand that to maintain certification as a Texas Master Naturalist I must complete 40 hours of volunteer service and 8 hours of Advanced Training annually.
- I understand I will pay my annual chapter dues (\$25) and participate in chapter activities.
