Description: It's that time of year again....Texas HEAT! Of course, that also means we get to wander

Crescent Bend at night during our monthly Owl Prowl.

If you're not familiar, we take participants around the park and look for scorpions, spiders, and hopefully owls. While walking we'll talk about anything in nature that sparks your interest. These walks are inspired by the interests and observations of those who attend. We will expand knowledge on all types of nature from soil, plants, insects, mammals, and birds, talking about their dependence, interaction and place in preserving the nature around us. You do not need to be an expert, just need to have a willingness to talk with people about becoming a Master Naturalist and answer questions that participants might have regarding things they see during our walk. Helping with Merlin and iNaturalist is always welcome since most people aren't familiar with those apps. We'll walk about a mile, finish in about an hour and the route is completely accessible. If you don't want to lead a group you're welcome to walk with another naturalist and work together to introduce visitors to the neat things to see in Crescent Bend at night. I have a supply of UV and normal flashlights that we pass out to let people look for spiders and scorpions but it would be really helpful if you have some of your own to bring for your use.

Description: The Schertz Pollinator Garden was installed by the Guadalupe Chapter of the Native Plant Society of Texas (NPSOT) in 2011-12 as a demonstration garden and habitat for pollinators.

This garden displays native plants in a semi-natural way, allowing them to achieve their natural shape and size (mostly). Plants are left as habitat during the winter and trimmed before spring growth.

The NPSOT team would appreciate the help of Master Naturalists several days a year (mostly in the spring, but there are a couple of fall dates scheduled) to prune plants and remove weeds.

Volunteers should bring their own weeding/pruning tools, gloves, and water.

Hot Texas summer forces a pause in the invasive plant removal at Park West. Work will resume in the Fall; watch for announcement in newsletter.



Guadalupe Chapter of Texas Master Naturalists will partner with H-E-B and Texan by Nature to Plant Trees for Texans in Park West

We are thrilled to announce that our chapter's grant application has been accepted and will be awarded \$5,000 in H-E-B's Trees for Texans program. This fall, we will plant over 130 trees in Park West, 125 seedlings and 6 large trees to help Texans cultivate a deeper connection to nature and promote environmental stewardship. Master Naturalists will plant native trees alongside H-E-B partners in Park West starting on November 6, 2025.

Resource Management Committee co-chairs, Nancy Masterson and John Barrington, planned and submitted the application. GMN volunteers will begin site preparation work-days in October, so watch for announcements of October Resource Management workdays

For over ten years, our chapter has scheduled volunteer workdays in the Park West forest. The 48-acre public park was acquired by the City of Seguin in 2013. Native trees provide crucial ecosystem services like air and water filtration, shade, and cooling. Trees also enhance our communities, providing educational opportunities and mental health benefits that enrich the quality of life of Texans.
