#### **Celebrating Park West's Trees**

Eleven years ago our new chapter had a dream; that the 48-acre Park West in Seguin, would someday be a true Texas forest instead of a monoculture of invasive plants. And we are making it so!

Come celebrate on Thursday November 6 at Park West, 601 N. Vaughan Ave., Seguin, to celebrate our first tree-planting, hear congratulations from our Mayor, City Councilman, H-E-B Trees for Texans, Texas Forest Service and our own Seguin Parks and Recreation Dept. Please come at 9 AM, the dignitaries arrive at 10:30 and the tree-planting ceremony will be at 11 AM, followed by light refreshments. Some could offer tours of the Thirteen Oaks area where we will plant over 100 seedlings.

The big shade trees are 1 Anaqua, 2 Pecans (Caddo and Kanza), 2 Cedar Elms, 2 Monterey Oaks. Then our work begins!

During November and December, we will plant and water 86 Texas Forest Service seedlings of 25 Bur Oaks, 25 Monterey Oaks, 15 Pecans, and 40 of our own Black Walnuts from seeds we gathered at Park West. We'll also plant small flowering trees of 14 Eve's Necklace and 7 Texas Redbuds.

Here's our schedule of Resource Management volunteer days:

Planting/Watering: Thursdays 8:30-11:30 AM; Nov. 13, 20, Dec. 4, 11, 18

Watering: Saturdays 9-10:30 AM; Nov. 15, 22, 29, Dec 6, 13, 20

Watering: Mondays 9:30-10 AM Nov. 17, 24, Dec. 8, 15

Watering: January 8:30-11:30: we drop to once a week on Thursdays Jan. 8,15, 22, 29

Watering: February, March, April, May: every other week on Thursdays

Watering: June to November 2026: once a month

So come plant a tree with us! We hope to get all the seedlings planted by December 18. So when you come, dress for outdoor work, bring a shovel and drinking water for yourself...and a gallon of tapwater for the little trees!

John Barrington and Nancy Masterson are co-chairs of Resource Management and will arrange for additional watering over the holidays. Nancy sends reminder texts; let her know you're coming at 830-305-9104.



## They're Here

Forest Restoration Co-chairs Nancy Masterson and John Barrington picked up the 86 trees for Park West. Varieties are Monterey Oaks, Bur Oaks, Pecans, Eve's Necklace and Texas Redbuds. We'll add our our own Black Walnut seedlings that Ehlers Tree Farm has raised from nuts collected at Park West by GMN volunteers.

Guadalupe Master Naturalists will start planting and watering in November.

#### **Project Feederwatch**

**Description:** A Cornell Lab of Ornithology community science project, FeederWatch is a November-April survey of birds that visit backyards, nature centers, community areas, and other locales in North America. Because the Cornell Lab of Ornithology is a non-profit organization supported primarily by participant and membership fees there is annual participation fee is



\$18 for U.S. residents.

To participate you choose two consecutive days as often as once a week and count the birds in your backyard, a local park, or other location. It's recommend to leave at least five days when you do not count between each of your two-day counts. Counting less often is fine. Even if you only count once all season, your data are valuable.


