COMMUNITY SCIENCE

Healthy Streams Project

What – Monitor the biological and chemical health of Cibolo Creek, Walnut Branch, and Geronimo Creek, all in Guadalupe County, primarily for long term trends. Biological communities to be assessed include, but not limited to, aquatic macroinvertebrates, fish species, and plants in the riparian areas. Water quality data will be taken in accordance with Texas Stream Team guidelines.

Why – Both Walnut Branch and Geronimo Creek are unique in that they are spring fed, continuously flowing water bodies. Geronimo Creek receives primarily non-point agricultural runoff, while Walnut Branch is in an urban setting, consequently receiving stormwater runoff from streets, parking lots, and lawns. Cibolo Creek is the receiving stream for approximately 10 million gallons per day of treated domestic sanitary wastewater.

Who – Monitoring will be conducted primarily by Texas Master Naturalists.

Where – Designated benchmark sampling sites have not yet been selected. These sites will be about 50 to 100 meters in length to include representative micro habitats within the stream.

When – The benchmark sites will be sampled over a two-week period every quarter. The quarterly sampling should allow for seasonal differences. Other areas of the streams may be sampled sporadically.

How – Standard non-lethal (where possible) aquatic organism sampling means will be employed, to include live traps, seines, creel surveys, drift nets, kick nets, etc. Transects through the riparian zone will be established and monitored to detect changes in plant communities.

Data Management – The benchmark sampling sites, including the riparian area, will be designated as Project Areas in iNaturalist. All organisms will be photographed and uploaded to iNaturalist, when possible. Identification of these organisms will be verified with iNaturalist and other similar organism identification apps. In addition, summary reports of the quarterly sampling periods will be maintained in-house with the Guadalupe Master Naturalists.

What kinds of observations should you make during CNC?

Any observations of WILD plants, animals, fungi, seaweed, bacteria, lichen, etc., you find in and around the San Antonio Metro Area. The San Antonio Metro Area includes 12 counties: Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Gillespie, Goliad, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, Medina, Wilson. Our area also includes Enchanted Rock State Natural Area, Lost Maples State Natural Area, and Palmetto State Park.

Observations of living or dead organisms, or evidence of those organisms, like shells, tracks, scat, feathers, etc., are fine. Remember to take good photos of the organisms!

Want to focus your observations more? Keep an eye out for Species of Greatest Conservation Need (SGCN), which are vulnerable species designated in Texas' Conservation Action Plan as most in need of conservation action.

San Marcos - Standard Core Water Quality Community Scientist Training

Description: Texas Stream Team [Standard Core](#) training with the [San Marcos River Rangers](#).

Standard Core monitoring involves performing tests for parameters of conductivity, dissolved oxygen, pH, total depth, water and air temperature, and water transparency using wet chemistry kit & observations while in the field; some fine motor control & vision is necessary to participate.

We will learn indoors, outdoors, and along shorelines, so please come prepared for the environment & weather! Training locations are generally accessible but may require participants to move over dirt track, trail, & shorelines. All locations have free parking within a 3-10 minute walk from our initial meeting location.
