### Shadowing

If you have had some training for being a field guide, you can ask to shadow an actual tour to gain further knowledge, see how a tour is conducted.

If you primarily listen to the actual field guide, count this as advanced training. AT:Presentations

If you contribute to the tour (interact with the participants, point out features on the trail, answer questions), you are assisting the primary tour guide. Count this as TR: Guide/Docent (service hours)

**Initial Training Hours**

These hours are the class and field trip hours for the training classes.  
They **do not** count as service and advanced training hours for the Initial Certification Dragonfly.

Members who have graduated from the TMN program are welcome to attend any of the classes as a refresher. They **do not** count toward any annual/cumulative service hours or advanced training hours requirements since they were part of the initial training program.

**Approved Activities**

All activities (for service hours and for advanced training hours) must be approved by the Chapter. Approved activities are listed in the calendar on our Chapter website, in the monthly newsletter, and in periodic emails from Pam Ball, Activities Director.  
When an activity is approved, it is only approved for the current calendar year. **Ongoing activities need to be re-approved every year.**  
Activities approved for other Master Naturalist Chapters are not automatically approved by our Chapter. You must submit them and request approval.
