Coyotes

The coyote is a wild canine within the genus Canis related to wolves, dogs, and jackals. Coyotes are larger than foxes. They have non-retractable claws for hunting. Coyotes prefer hunting larger prey, e.g., deer and rabbits. Coyotes, while intelligent, are not as clever as foxes.



Foxes

Vulpes is a genus of the Canidae colloquially referred to as true foxes, however animals in other genera may have "fox" names. Foxes are shorter and smaller than coyotes. They also have non-retractable claws for hunting. Foxes are opportunistic predators, eating a variety of prey including mammals, birds and insects. Foxes have strong problemsolving skills.




Canines to Clementine

Claws non-retracting, and nocturnal,


Coyotes sometimes out in day.




Canine exploration
