

Cypress Basin Texas Master Naturalists Minutes from January 13, 2020

Becky called the meeting to order.

Roll call by sign-in sheet.

There were no questions about November minutes.

Charles gave the treasurer's report. He reported that 1700.00 dollars had been made on cookbook sales. There are 26 cookbooks left. Membership dues are due at this time.

Becky took a few minutes for cares, concerns, and joys.

Cookbook Update: There are 26 left. Reprints are possible. There was discussion of renting a GCLA table to sell the cookbooks at the barbecue. Linda was recognized for her contribution of editing the cookbook. The many hours spent by Barry and Caroline in making the cookbook a successful venture was also recognized.

VMS: Linda discussed VMS. She stated that we are starting a new year, and entries should be made within 45 days of the service performed.

Memorial Projects were discussed for Donald Swofford, Barry Hughes, and Jim Ingold. David is working on memorial benches. Memorial plaques will be added to benches. Ted will check on final placement of benches.

- Jill commented that Todd Macon at Caddo Mounds was willing to provide some AT training (possibly Oct. 17th).
- The members discussed the possibility of road trips to North East Texas Prairies restoration projects, Daphne Prairie Preserve, Clymer Meadow; attending members were interested. Appropriate personnel will be contacted about field trips. At this time, May or June are possible months for a scheduled visit.
- Many were interested in iNaturalist training. Vanessa will contact TPWD about the possibility of this training.
- Becky noted that AT is possible Morley Hudson Greenhouse, Collins Academy, Ecoverdant, schools, parks, Caddo State Park, Lake O' the Pines, and numerous other sources

Flotilla

• Stella announced 2020 Flotilla date as April 25th. The first planning meeting will be Jan. 18th at 10:00 at refuge. Anyone who wants to help with flotilla should let Stella know.

Ongoing Projects were discussed as follows:

- Refuge trails are in bad shape due to recent storm. Members need to walk trails. Charles or Becky offered to walk trails with members who
 are not comfortable walking trails. Vanessa suggested that signage and maps that would make trail access easier might be a possible project.
 Badges for trails was discussed.
- Vanessa discussed a trail reclamation project near refuge headquarters. A picnic table could be added. Vanessa reported that the area is easy birding and would be a good location for a butterfly garden or native plants area.
- Kim reported on bird feeders and a sign-up sheet for Bird Herd was sent around.
- Bluebird Buddies project was discussed. Some houses need to be relocated or replaced. Sue Simmons and the Woodruffs are taking the lead on this project.
- Ted gave an update on paddling trails. Backwater Jack's needs clearer trailhead markers. A possible kayak trip on these trails was discussed.
 Vanessa also discussed using flotilla money for aluminum frames for signage. Signs are free but placing the aluminum frames will be a major undertaking since they are very heavy.
- Susan awarded the certification, recertification, and milestone pins. Susan noted that the organization had 54 members who volunteered
 over 5400 hours this year.

Next meeting will be February 10th.

Attendees then broke into small committee groups to organize and plan.

Meeting adjourned.

Black History Month

In honor of Black History Month, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's Buffalo Soldiers program celebrated its 25th anniversary with a founder's event and exhibit unveiling February 7, 20202 at the TPWD headquarters building in Austin. The next is Captain Charles Young. Captain Young was born into slavery in Kentucky on March 12, 1864. He became the third African American graduate of the United States Military Academy, the first black US National Park Superintendent, first black military attaché, first black man to achieve the rank of colonel in the US Army, and highest-ranking black officer in the regular army until his death in 1922. As the Superintendent for the Sequoia and General Grant national parks, Young ensured the preservation of the great wilderness, and

commanded a group of park rangers that became known as the "Buffalo Soldiers" keeping the park free from poachers and ranchers whose grazing sheep destroyed the parks' natural habitats. Young also managed road construction to allow more visitors to enjoy it completing a wagon road to the Giant Forest, home of the world's largest trees, and a road to the base of the famous Moro Rock.
