Mounting materials, plant specimens, and written instructions were provided to the members.

Nancy Webber demonstrated the glass gluing process as a reminder before members chose specimens and worked at two plexiglass stations. Native grasses were spot welded by Linda Jo Conn and Dorothy Mayer at a separate table. All mounted specimens were set aside to dry overnight.

Nonnative specimens and duplicates were set aside for delivery to the Herbarium for sharing with other researchers/herbariums.

All specimens were left to dry overnight. Joyce is to retrieve specimens November 17, 2017, for later delivery to either the Herbarium or the El Camino Real National Historic Trails Association (for 2018 museum tour).

**Suggested Materials List** for future plant mounting sessions: specimens and labels, 18x25 or larger plexiglass (should be smooth on at least one side; ¼ inch thick), archival glue, natural fiber paint brush (~2-1/2 inch wide), container for brush, container for water, newsprint, cardboard, Elmers glue (if needed), wood blocks (for spot welding specimens), wax paper, tweezers, weights, mounting papers, debris papers (to make envelopes), instruction sheet, and a plant book.
