

REID FERRING, Ph.D. – UNIVERSITY OF NORTH TEXAS

Reid Ferring is Professor and Interim Chair in the Department of Geography and the Environment, University of North Texas. He earned a Ph.D. in Archaeology at Southern Methodist University and a Ph.D. in Geology from the University of Texas at Dallas. His research interests include Quaternary geology, geoarchaeology, Paleoindian archaeology and the Early Paleolithic in Eurasia. He has done research in Texas, Oklahoma, Israel, Portugal and Crimea. Since 1995 he has been a member of the Dmanisi Project in the Republic of Georgia. Dated to ca. 1.85 million years ago, Dmanisi is the oldest archaeological site in Eurasia. Excavations there have yielded over 70 human fossils attributed to earliest *Homo erectus*, and thousands of animal fossils and stone artifacts.
