Introducing the 2022 Recertification Pin



The Lightning Whelk (Busycon perversum pulleyi) was designated as the state shell of Texas in 1987. Named for Dr. T.E. Pulley, a well-known Texas naturalist and teacher, it is one of the few that is "left handed", and one of the first shells to appear on a US postage stamp.



Recognizing the challenges of remaining an active member during the COVID pandemic, the state is again awarding a special "Service Against All Odds" pin to the **59** GLC members who logged at least 8 AT hours and 1 volunteer hour in 2021. The pins will be awarded in March.
