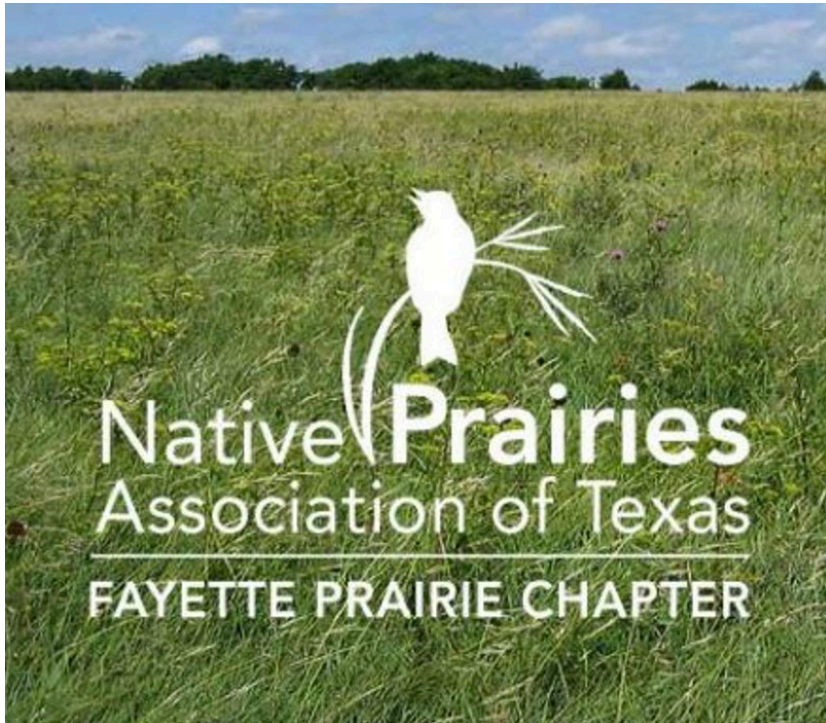
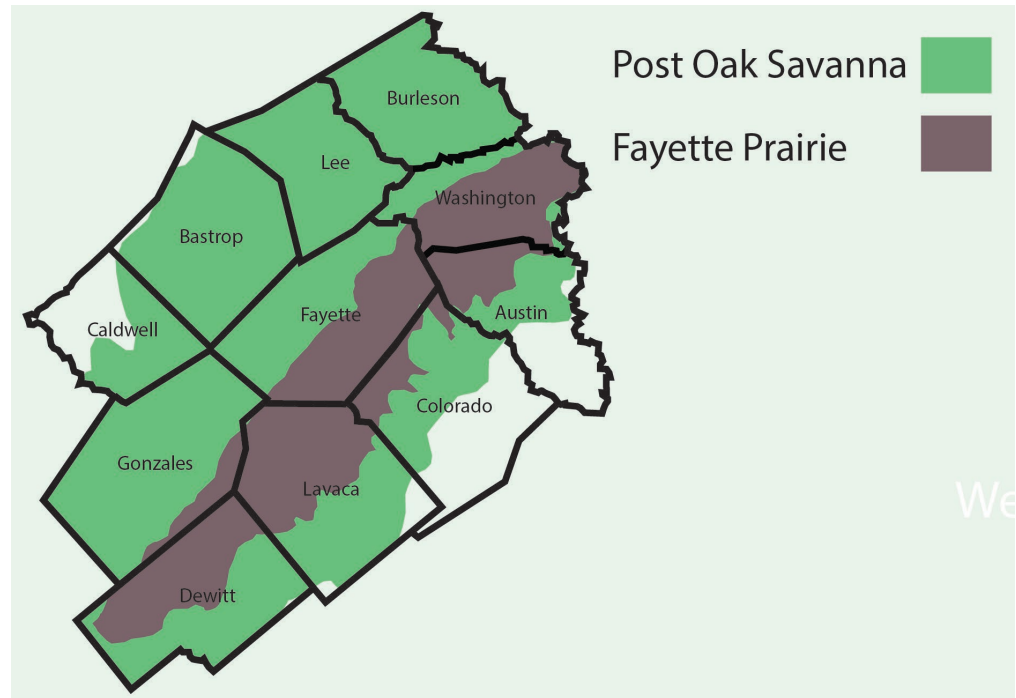


Keeping Texas Prairie ...



- 501(c)(3) nonprofit and accredited land trust
- 5,000+ acres in conservation easements or ownership
- Mission
 - Conservation and restoration of prairies and savannas
 - Education on the role of prairie/savanna ecosystems in the natural world
- Five Chapters
 - Blackland
 - **Fayette Prairie**
 - Forth Worth
 - Houston
 - San Antonio

- Encompasses 11 counties
- Unique in NPAT
 - No large urban centers
 - Most members are landowners
- Recently developed and piloting a **Small Acreage Restoration Program**

Fayette Prairie Chapter Smaller Acreage Restoration Program

- < 25 acres generally falls below TPWD's cutoff for PUB/GRIP programs
- SARP created to address the need of <25 acres
 - Works closely with TPWD/OPJV in restoration plan
 - Additional benefits of NPAT engagement
- SARP Plan design
 - Covers 50% of upfront herbicide (2 sprayings) and grass/forb seed cost
 - Landowners responsible for other 50%, vendor costs, ongoing follow-up
 - NPAT workdays to assist landowner
 - Possible use of NPAT equipment (TRUAX seed drill, sprayer,)
- Requirements
 - < 25-acre restoration project
 - NPAT Fayette Prairie Chapter membership
 - NPAT contract
- Ecosystem benefits
 - Create more wildlife habitat
 - Small tracts directly benefit birds and pollinators
 - Contribute to habitat 'corridor' concept
