Field Trips

We have another field trip opportunity in April! Tom Hardaway, fearless herpetologist, has volunteered to lead us on a herp walk. This is an approved AT opportunity. See Tom's description below.

"Spring is here and with it, warmer weather. The snakes will be out so why don't we go herping?"

This is Tom Hardaway, and I would like to take you Master Naturalists out herping and also teach you a little about reptiles, amphibians, and how to identify them.

The study of reptiles and amphibians is Herpetology, and it's called "herping" when we go looking for them. And collectively, reptiles and amphibians as a group are referred to as "herps".
