Dear Texas Master Naturalist Program Applicant:

Thank you for your interest in Texas Master Naturalist™, Lower Trinity Basin Chapter. The mission of the Texas Master Naturalist program is to develop a corps of well-informed volunteers to provide education, outreach, and service dedicated to the beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within their communities for the State of Texas. This program will further participants' understanding and appreciation of the natural resources of the state of Texas through interesting presentations by local experts covering a wide range of topics from botany to land stewardship. Classroom learning will be reinforced by hands-on field trips in local ecosystems. Throughout the course, you will find strategies for helping others recognize and appreciate those resources. Specific class and field trip topics are listed in the Class Schedule. Texas Master Naturalist trainees may select from a wide variety of approved local projects to volunteer their time. Projects may include field research, habitat restoration, native plant rescues, prairie seed collection, school habitats, educational presentations, or projects of your own design approved by the chapter.

To become certified as a Master Naturalist through the Lower Trinity Basin Chapter, trainees must fulfill the following requirements:

Attendance at all training classes including field trips, plus 40 hours (minimum) of volunteer service on approved projects within a year, and 8 hours (minimum) of advanced training in approved classes within a year. As mandated by the State of Texas trainees must be at least 18 years of age.

To maintain active status, Texas Master Naturalists must annually complete (at minimum) the following:

40 hours of volunteer service on approved projects, and 8 hours of advanced training in approved classes.

Training classes will be held at 6:00 p.m. on the days designated in the attached schedule. Most classes will be held at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, 2041 Trinity Street, Liberty, Texas. Field trips are included on the schedule. Times for field trips will be announced as the date for that field trip approaches. The fee for this training session is \$175. The class will be limited to 15 participants. Selection criteria include interest in the program, availability for

volunteer service and commitment to stewardship of local natural resources. Trainees cannot bring visitors to the classroom or on field trips.

Background Check: All members must submit and pass a YPS/CBC background check as performed and paid for by the State of Texas.
