For VMS Admins

The Virtual Fair Opportunity should stay in the statewide folder.

You will be able to see hours that your volunteers have recorded when you look at their logbooks.

If you want to see if someone is approved for the Virtual Fair: select the volunteer, select Request/Approve and select All Folders in the top right corner of the window.

When recording hours into the Fair Opportunity Volunteers should put event title, location and information into the notes field of the Logbook Entry.
